<p>Students will become familiar with the coastal processes, including mass movement that shape the UK's coastline. They will understand how these processes lead to the formation of distinctive coastal landforms such as headlands and bay, caves, arches and stacks.</p> <p>Students will examine the issues facing those living along the coast, including the threat of sea level rise, as well as the on going process of erosion. Students will look at how best to manage these threats, weighing up the costs and benefits of different coastal management strategies.</p> <p>The unit will lead into the GCSE Geography Controlled Assessment, which is worth 25% of each student's final grade. They will collect the required data during a day's fieldwork to the Pett Level Beach and complete their assessment in school under exam conditions.</p>	<p>Students will recap all three topics, which make up the physical geography exam paper. These topics include;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tectonic Processes • River Processes • Coastal Processes <p>Students will revise these topics with a strong emphasis placed upon the construction of detailed case studies looking at the causes, effects and responses of tectonic, river and coastal hazards.</p> <p>Each and every lesson will see students revising through a wealth of past exam questions, helping students to revise content whilst also practicing and developing their exam technique. To assist students in developing the required exam technique students will be introduced to and learn to use the required exam success criteria needed to construct an exam answer.</p>	<p>Students will recap all three topics, which make up the human geography exam paper.
