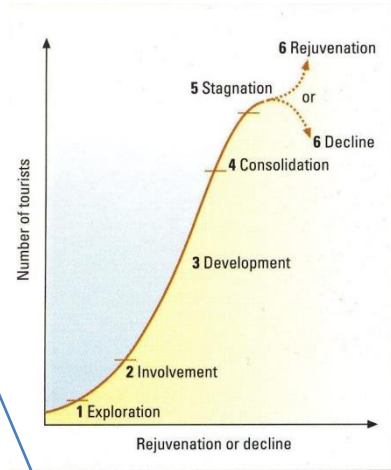

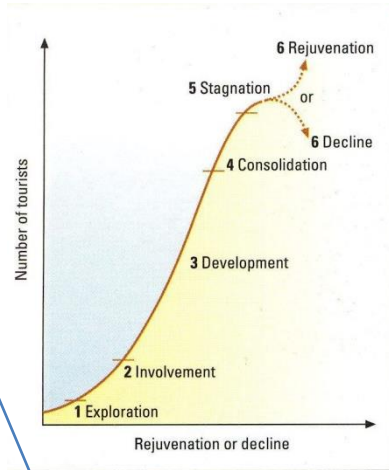

Montserrat July 1995 - A Volcanic eruption in a poor country

#### Effects

- Two thirds of Island covered in ash
- Crops destroyed by ash
- 19 Dead
- Tourism industry stopped

#### Responses

- UK Government gave £41million for rebuild
- 5000 people evacuated and left island
- New houses, schools, hospitals were built
